

ARTICLE XV -- SANCTIONS AND LICENSES

- Section 1. The Executive Board shall have power to grant or to withhold from each member club of the Federation, or the Federation itself, a sanction to hold a cat show.
- a) There shall be a Judging Coordinator elected in the same manner as the officers. This office shall be responsible for the issuance and granting of sanctions to hold cat shows under the rules of this Federation and for the approval of requested judges licensed by this Federation or guest judges licensed by similar organizations to officiate in cat shows sanctioned by this Federation. The Judging Coordinator shall have such other duties as the Executive Board may from time to time determine.
 - b) The Office of the Judging Coordinator shall not be held by any active judge. In the event that a judge accepts the nomination for this office, his license to judge shall be suspended and his name removed from the list of those eligible to judge in this or other similar organizations until such time as his term in office is completed, at which time his name shall be returned to the Judging List and his license restored. He may complete assignments contracted prior to nomination.
- Section 2. No member club shall hold, sponsor, or manage a cat show not sanctioned by this Federation, nor shall it hold, sponsor or manage a cat show sanctioned by any other Federation. This does not prohibit a cat show sanctioned by this Federation from being held in conjunction with a similar organization so long as a sharp distinction is maintained as to the separate organizations and separate rules to be followed and has prior approval of the Executive Board.
- Section 3. New clubs which put on a CFF-sanctioned show within eighteen (18) months of their acceptance in the Federation shall be given free sanctions for their first show. These free sanctions shall consist of the first two All-breed rings and first four Specialty rings.
