

STANDING RULE #13 -- PARADE OF PERFECTION SCORER

The Parade of Perfection Scorer shall:

1. Be appointed annually by the President.
2. Keep the scoring methodology current with changes made in the CFF Show Rules. A complete copy of the scoring methodology must be filed with the Recording Secretary at all times.
3. Have the responsibility for tabulating the Parade scoring from the marked show catalogs submitted to the Scorer as stipulated under CFF Show Rules.
4. Inform the past season's winners by mail as soon as possible after the close of the show season, but no later than June 1 of the new show season. These announcements shall also include an invitation to advertise the Parade of Perfection wins in the CFF Yearbook.
5. Submit a complete listing of the Parade winners to the CFF Newsletter Editor, CFF President, and to CATS magazine, as soon as possible after the winners have been notified.
6. Have the responsibility of ordering the certificates, ribbons, rosettes, and awards for the Parade winners.
7. Mail the correctly inscribed certificates with their respective awards to the Parade winners before August 31.
8. Be reimbursed for those expenses incurred in the Parade presentation. The Scorer will be paid \$2.0 per specialty and \$4.00 per Allbreed show.
9. Not be an active judge. In the event that a judge accepts appointment to this position, his license to judge shall be suspended and his name removed from the list of those eligible to judge in this or similar organizations until such time as his appointment is completed, at which time his name shall be returned to the judging list and his license restored. He may complete assignments contracted prior to his appointment.
10. Adult championship, altered championship and kitten entries must be CFF-registered by the end of the show season in order to be eligible for Parade of Perfection wins. (Retroactive to May 1, 1993)
11. Requests for an individual cat's scores before the end of the season must be written and accompanied by a fee of \$5.00.
